## ORDINANCE NO. 408

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF LEESPORT, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, REDEFINING SEASONAL POOL AND REGULATING THE USE OF POOL STRUCTURE AS A BARRIER.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Leesport, Berks County, Pennsylvania, and IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2. of Ordinance No. 407 is amended to read as follows:

<u>Definition</u>. The term "Seasonal Pool", when used in this Ordinance, shall mean a container or other structure intended to be filled with water to a depth of 24 inches or more for swimming, recreational bathing or wading and designed for temporary placement and use only during the swimming season.

SECTION 2. Section 3.e. is revised to read as follows:

e. Seasonal Pools shall be entirely enclosed with a barrier or fence not less than four feet in height and having no opening greater than four inches a side (or in diameter in the case of round openings). The required barrier or fence shall be installed and removed in conjunction with the placement and removal of the Seasonal Pool, except for any fence constructed in accordance with the provisions of the Leesport Borough Zoning Ordinance of 1972, as amended. Where the Seasonal Pool structure is used as a barrier or where the barrier is mounted on top of the pool structure, and the means of access is a ladder, steps or some other artificial device, then the means of access shall be capable of being secured, locked or removed to prevent access.

SECTION 2. Any Ordinance or part thereof inconsistent herewith is hereby repealed insofar as it is inconsistent herewith.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately.
