Big Steps with Little Steps E.C.C.

Lexi Kennedy, a name familiar throughout the SVSD, has brought a new, yet familiar, childhood center to Leesport by opening *Little Steps Early Childhood Center* on Leesport Avenue in May of 2022.

Many residents may already be familiar with the location of the center as it was once *Tikes and Tots Daycare*, where Lexi worked until the previous owner retired. Already having a rapport with countless families and the community, Lexi embraced the idea of reopening the center and making it her own. After months of paperwork, inspections, and sleepless nights, *Little Steps E.C.C.* came to life.

Little Steps offers education and family care services for children of all ages. Her education focuses on five key areas of child development including: physical, social, emotional, language and cognition, using playbased, hands-on learning with activities focusing on motor, literacy, math, friendship, and outdoor skills.

The center operates Monday through Friday from 6:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. to school age students that live within the Schuylkill Valley School District have access to buses for transportation.

Lexi graduated from Hamburg High School and is currently pursuing her master's degree in Early Childhood Development at Ashworth College.

Lexi is a certified Child Development Associate (CDA) in preschool education as well as skilled in American Sign Language (ASL), Picture Exchange Communication System (PEC), Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), in addition to many behavior management certifications and trainings.

Outside of operating *Little Steps E.C.C.*, Lexi is very involved in activities around the community as she coaches soccer, basketball and baseball for boys and girls at Schuylkill Valley.

Responsible Pet Ownership

Part 2 from the Animal Rescue League of Berks County

Helping manage animal overpopulation by spaying/neutering pet.

Spaying or neutering your pet prevents more animals from becoming homeless down the road. At the Animal Rescue League of Berks County, we do our part by spaying and neutering all dogs and cats in our care before placing them into a new home! Should you need to have your pet spay or neuter, you can make an appointment through the ARL's Surgery Center at <u>www.berksarl.org/spay-neuter</u>.

Ensuring pets are properly identified and their information in databases is correct/up to date. Microchips are proven to be the most effective identification source in helping your pet return home in the case they get lost, but don't forget: To maximize their effectiveness, it is important to ensure all registration and contact information is correct and up to date. Other methods of identification can help too, such as having your pet wear an ID tag on a collar and having clear, well-lit, full-length, and close-up pictures of your pet on your phone or computer to share with police, shelters, and websites in case he or she ever goes missing.

Socializing and or training your pet.

Appropriate socialization and training for your pet can improve the quality of life for your pet because it promotes confidence, provides mental stimulation, and strengthens the human-animal bond. Training can also help alleviate deeper feelings of anxiety and stress that are often presented as unwanted behavioral issues.

Providing exercise and mental stimulation for your pet.

Exercise and mental stimulation are just as crucial for development in our animal companions as it is for people. It is worth asking how much time you can commit to exercising your pet and how much space you have in your home and/or property for a new pet before bringing a new animal companion home.

Caring for the world around you.

Your pet is a part of the ecosystem around you, which is why it is important to care for the world around you together. Committing to proper waste disposal and not allowing pets to become stray or feral are easy ways to look after an animal companion and the ecosystem responsibly.

Now that you've learned what it takes to be a responsible pet owner, it's time to do some research on caring for your desired pet.
