Recreation and Greenways


- Installed new windows at the pool's concession stand.

Overview of Ordinances

No. 379 – Amending Ordinance No. 365 by restricting the parking of certain types of vehicles on borough streets. In part the ordinance states: It shall be unlawful for any person to park, or allow to remain parked, a commercial motor vehicle with a registered gross weight in excel of 7,000 pounds, a motor home, a camper, a recreational vehicle, a boat, camping or utility trailer or any other similar motorized or non-motorized vehicle or device on any borough street for more than a twenty-four (24) hour period during the months of November, December, January, February and March.





Water System

- Installed electric generators and LP tanks at our wells in the event of a power failure.
- Installed the RAFA system for a more efficient and automatic daily running of our system.
- Installed automatic chlorine analyzers and a chlorine alarm system.
- Installed new equipment for daily water quality testing.
- Upgraded our water meter reading system.
- Replaced over 200 electronic meters and installed approximately 20 new water shut off valves.
- Applied for a grant to provide the SVSD complex with an auxiliary water service.

Sewage Treatment Plant

Upgrades to our sewer plant.

Memorials

Installed several Hometown Heroes Banners.

Personnel

- Hired a part-time administrative assistant.
- Hired a part-time public works laborer.

Ordinances & Resolutions

- Adopted a re-inspection ordinance for home resales.
- Adopted a well head protection program and ordinance.
- Signed an ordinance with Ontelaunee Township to save 500 acres for agricultural preservation.

Community Outreach

- Produced quarterly newsletters.
- Participated in the Memorial Day Celebration.
- Participated at National Night Out in August.
- P.O.S of A. placed a retired American Flag box at the borough hall.









Heating Assistance Program Now Open

Residents who struggle with their home heating bills can now apply for assistance from the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). LIHEAP is a federally funded program that helps individuals and families pay their heating bills through home heating energy assistance grants. It also provides crisis grants to help in the event of an emergency or if a resident is in danger of losing his or her heat due to broken equipment, lack of fuel or termination of utility service.

The income eligibility guidelines for LIHEAP are set at 150% of the federal poverty income level. For example, the income limit for an individual is \$21,870 and for a family of four it is \$45,000. Residents may apply for LIHEAP online at compass.state.pa.us, by phone at 1-866-550-4355 or by contacting the County Assistance Office in their county of residence.



Hello friends and neighbors,

It's hard to believe that it's almost winter again. Soon the weather will bring ice, snow and all of those complications to daily living. We would like to offer you some tips on dealing with the winter weather:

- Keep a blanket, some food (like protein bars), and other supplies in your car in case you get unexpectedly stuck somewhere in a storm.
- Make sure your roof and windshield are clear of ice and snow BEFORE driving. Not only is it dangerous to have snow and ice fall off your vehicle while driving, it's also illegal.
- -Slow down and leave extra space to stop on wet and icy roads. Even 4 Wheel Drive doesn't mean "4 Wheel Stop".
- When shoveling or blowing snow from your sidewalks and driveways, DO NOT shovel or blow it into the street. This creates further hazards and is also illegal.
- In the event of a major snowfall, check in on your neighbors. Make sure they're OK.
- Familiarize yourself with the snow emergency routes in your neighborhood, and be sure to keep them clear (No parked cars) when a snow emergency is issued.
- Allow enough space for the snowplows to get down your street otherwise they can't plow you out.
- Clear your sidewalks of ice and snow in a timely manner.

Winter isn't all bad, and the snow can be fun. Try to take some time out to safely enjoy it. Spring will be here before you know it.




