LAHS Celebrating 20th Anniversary in 2024.

Founded in 2004 and officially, the Leesport Jaycee Foundation d.b.a.: Leesport Area Historical Society, the LAHS is a 501(c)3 Non-Profit, organized under the Charter of the Leesport Jaycees.

We are proud to be one of the few local historical societies that owns its own building.

Built along Main Street around 1858, the West Leesport School was the center of education for the town's children for over 100 years.



128 Main Street

Last used as a school in Spring of 1961. It was sold, converted for use as a warehouse for Wright's Knitware who had a mill across Main Street. When it was learned that they wanted to demolish the building to add parking spaces, a group of concerned residents and former students of the school convinced them to sell the property to the Leesport Jaycees for \$1.00 in 1981.

When The Leesport Jaycees decided to disband, members decided to create the LAHS under its Charter in 2004. A new electric service, HVAC system, plumbing and security system was added. A new classroom floor was installed, matching the look of the original. New energy efficient windows were installed in 2021.

The restored classroom is available for groups to experience a "one room school". The other first floor room is set up as a display area for our museum collections.

One of the two rooms on the 2nd floor of the building is being organized into an archive for genealogical research with a large library of research books, family histories, as well as a digital archive of photographs, obituaries, death certificates and newspaper clippings featuring stories from the area.





Online Option to Pay County Real Estate Taxes

Leesport Borough residents can now pay outstanding annual and interim real estate tax bills via credit/debit cards. All outstanding tax bills issued within the calendar year will be combined into one payment. The bill(s) must be paid in full; no partial payments are permitted. The option to select and pay only one bill (if more than one bill is outstanding) is not available. This online option is for county/municipal real estate taxes only. Delinquent taxes, school taxes, and any other taxes (such as per capita) are not paid through this site. Delinquent tax payments can be made via the Tax Claim website.






To obtain vouchers, a resident must get appointment/s first. Come to the Borough office with your ID (you decide which ID to use) and your appointment dates to get voucher/s.

Loaner traps are available 1 week prior to surgery appointment.






Be Aware of Tax Season Scams

The Office of Attorney General is warning Pennsylvanians to be aware and stay cautious of Internal Revenue Service (IRS) imposter scams during tax season. Be on the lookout for unsolicited text messages, emails or phone calls appearing to be from the IRS demanding immediate payment or your personal information.

The Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General and the IRS both strongly recommend filing taxes early before scammers have the chance to use any personal information and file a fake tax return.

Please remember the IRS:

- Does not initiate contact with taxpayers by email, text messages or phone calls to request personal or financial information (generally the IRS first mails a paper bill to a person who owes taxes).
- Will never demand a specific type of payment using cash, cryptocurrency, a prepaid debit card, gift card or a wire transfer.
- Will not leave a pre-recorded, urgent, or threatening message on an answering system.
- Will not immediately threaten to sue or arrest you.
